SOME OF MY PAST EXPERIENCES DURING THE SUMMER – SOME PAID SOME NOT.

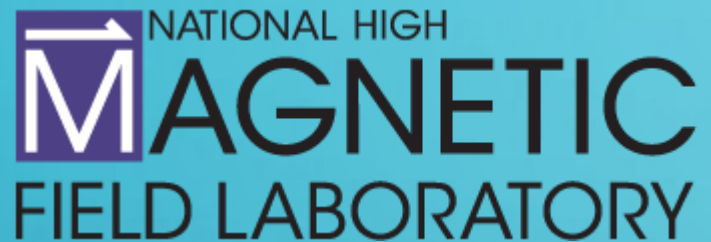
- PPPL – Plasma summer camp for teachers

ALWAYS ASK.

- Most experiences I have had came from me talking with people and asking if they have a place for me during the summer.
 - Do you hire teachers to work at your establishment?
 - Do you have a teacher internship program?
- AAPT National meetings - ask professors from universities you would like to intern with. Do you have research positions for teachers?
- National Science Foundation – Read through grants that interest you. It gives the contact person and approximately how many folks they will need to work on the projects.

- The program is for US citizens only.
- The program pays a stipend of \$3,600.
- Travel reimbursements of up to \$600 are paid to non-local residents.
- Housing is provided for non-local participants.
- Participants are required to participate in the entire six weeks of the program.
- Participants are required to attend all daily and weekly meetings, seminars, field trips and workshops.
